

## English Vocabulary: Adjectives with “-worthy” (PT: digno)

### 1) **worthy** (deserving)

- Your race does not make you more **worthy** or less **worthy** of respect.
- Showing disrespect makes you **unworthy** of respect.

### 2) **trustworthy** (deserving of trust)

- My current tenant is an extremely **trustworthy** person.
- My previous tenant is an **untrustworthy** person.

### 3) **roadworthy, seaworthy, airworthy** (suitable for use as transport)

- Cars must be **roadworthy** before they can be driven on public roads.
- Cars without lights are **unroadworthy**.
- Ships are **seaworthy** only if they pass a series of rigorous tests.
- It is dangerous to navigate the oceans in an **unseaworthy** ship.
- A pilot must inspect his airplane to see if it is **airworthy** before every flight.
- **Unairworthy** planes must undergo immediate repair.



### 4) **noteworthy** (deserving of a note)

- Nearly everything that my teacher says is **noteworthy**.

### 5) **newsworthy** (deserving of a news report)

- An earthquake in Japan is **newsworthy**.
- A cat stuck in a tree is **unnewsworthy**.



### 6) **praiseworthy** (deserving of approval and admiration)

- Any deity of any religion is **praiseworthy**.
- My friend completed the Ironman competition. That is certainly **praiseworthy**.

### 7) **creditworthy** (considered suitable to receive credit, not a financial risk)

- The owner of a property is usually **creditworthy**.
