abc	<i>Small letters (UK) / Lowercase letters (USA)</i>

1) First person singular, subject pronoun: I

2) Proper names:

People	John Smith, Elizabeth Jones, Michael Jackson
Groups	The Beatles, The London Philharmonic Orchestra
Companies	Microsoft, Renault, Nike
Places	Atlantic Ocean, Mount Everest, River Thames
Planets	Mars, Earth, Saturn
Buildings	Eiffel Tower, Empire State Building
Pets	Spot, Snowbell, Tom
Cities	London, Rio de Janeiro
Countries	France, Brazil

3) Titles: He is a manager in my company. He is the Logistics Manager.
He is our king. He is King Charles III.
He is a lord. He is Lord Brown.

4) Languages and Nationalities: French, Spanish, British, Portuguese, Brazilian

5) Historical events: World War I, Independence Day, Battle of Waterloo

6) Months: January, February, March

7) Days of the week: Monday, Tuesday, Saturday

8) Celebrations: Christmas, Easter, Halloween

9) Religion:

<i>Gods</i>	Christ, Mohammed, Buddha
<i>Religions</i>	Islam, Judaism, Catholicism
<i>References to a god(s)</i>	He, Him, His, She, Her, Hers, They, Them, Their
