



## Verb Tenses:

- **Past simple:** I **had** my car **washed** yesterday.
- **Present simple:** I **have** my car **washed** every week.
- **Present continuous:** I **am having** my car **washed** at the moment.
- **Future simple:** I **will have** my car **washed** tomorrow.  
or: I **am going to have** my car **washed** tomorrow.
- **Present Perfect:** I **have had** my car **washed** many times.  
I **have had** my car **fixed**.  
I **have had** my house **painted**.  
I **have had** my nails **done**.  
I **have had** my hair **dyed**.

## Questions:

## Vocabulary (services):

- A TV repair shop is where you **have** your TV **fixed**.
- A barber is where you **have** your beard **trimmed**.
- A hospital is where you **have** your health problem **cured**.
- A pet shop is where you **have** your dog **washed**.
- A gas station is where you **have** your car **filled**.
- A laundry is where you **have** your suit **cleaned**.
- A hairdresser is where you **have** your hair **styled**.
- An optician is where you **have** your eyes **checked**.
- A workshop is where you **have** your car **fixed**.

## Bad events

We can also use the same structure when someone does something bad to us:

- Jenny **had** her car **stolen**. (*Somebody stole her car.*)
- I **had** my nose **broken** in a fight. (*Somebody broke my nose.*)
- I **had** my bank account **hacked** recently. (*Somebody hacked my account.*)
- She often **has** her passwords **stolen**, because they're easy to guess. (*Somebody hacks her computer account because she doesn't use secure passwords.*)
