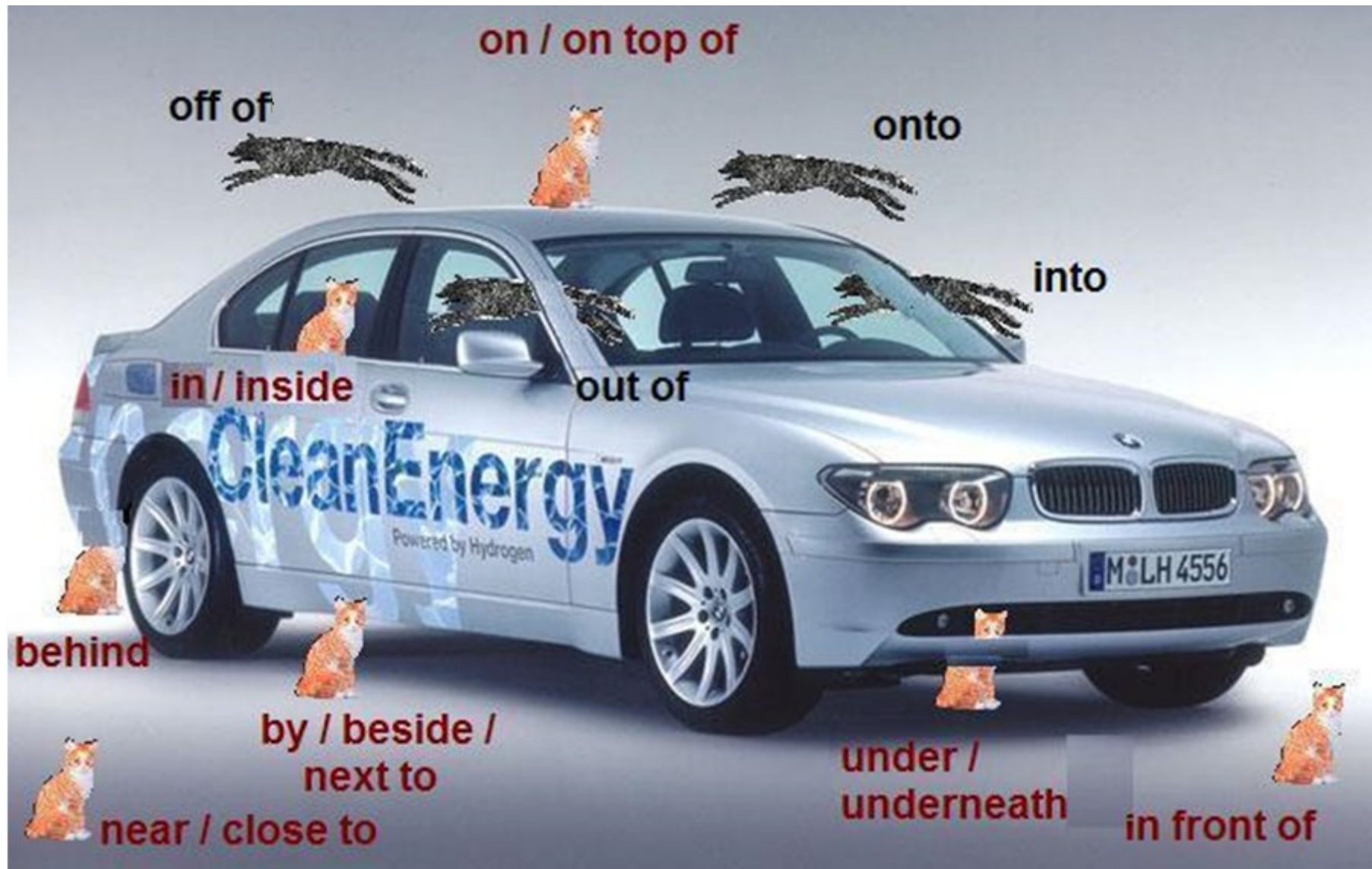


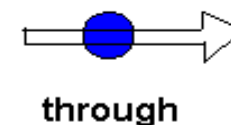
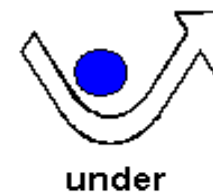
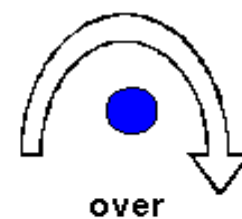
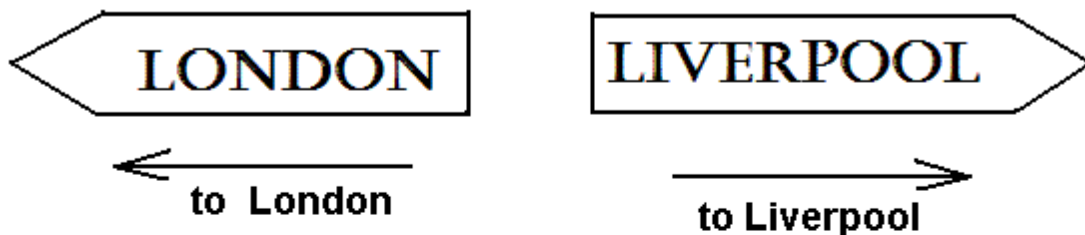
English Prepositions – Location and Movement



Examples:

The cat jumped into the car.



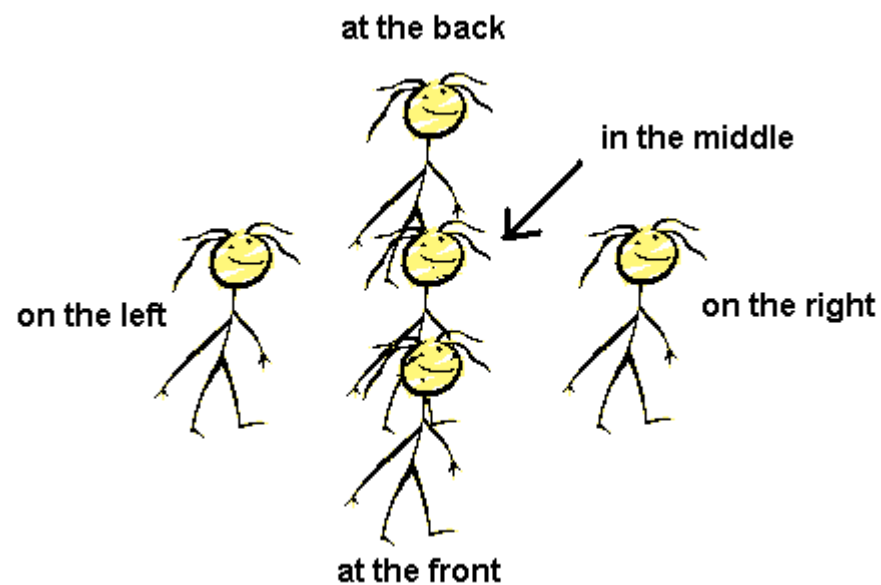
He's going from London to Liverpool

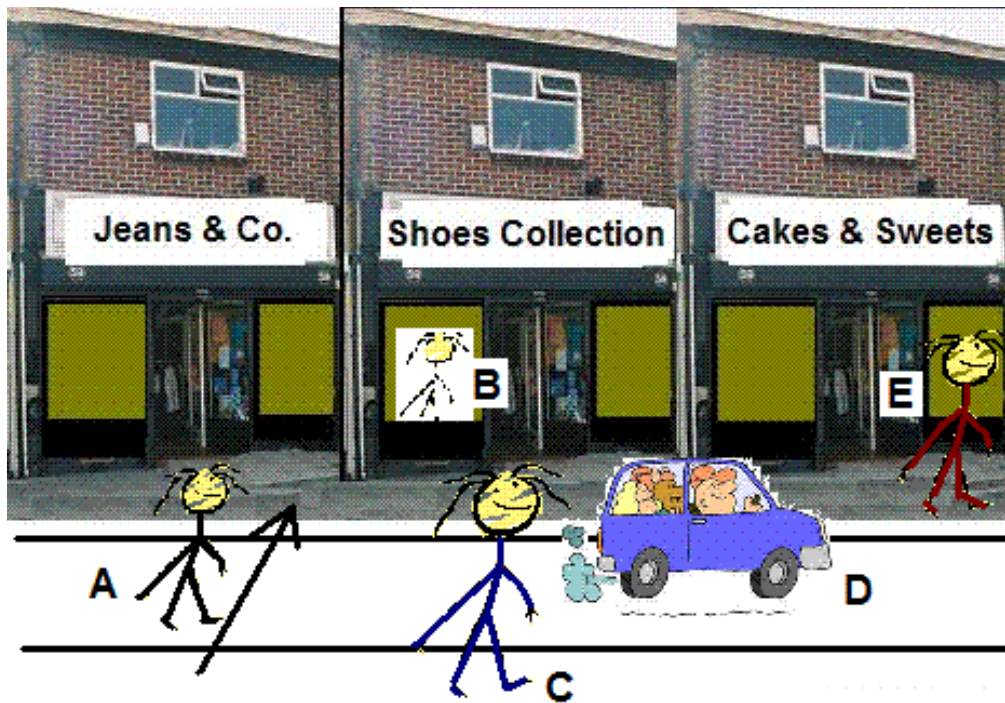


the car goes up

The flats are over / above the shops.

The shops are below the flats.

The jeans shop is next to the shoe shop.

The cake shop is on the right of the shoe shop.

The shoe shop is on the left of the cake shop.

The shoe shop is between the jeans shop and the cake shop.

A: He is going across the road. / He is crossing the road

B: He is in/inside the shop.

C: He is opposite the shoe shop.

D: He is driving along the road.

E: He is outside/in front of the cake shop.

at the airport

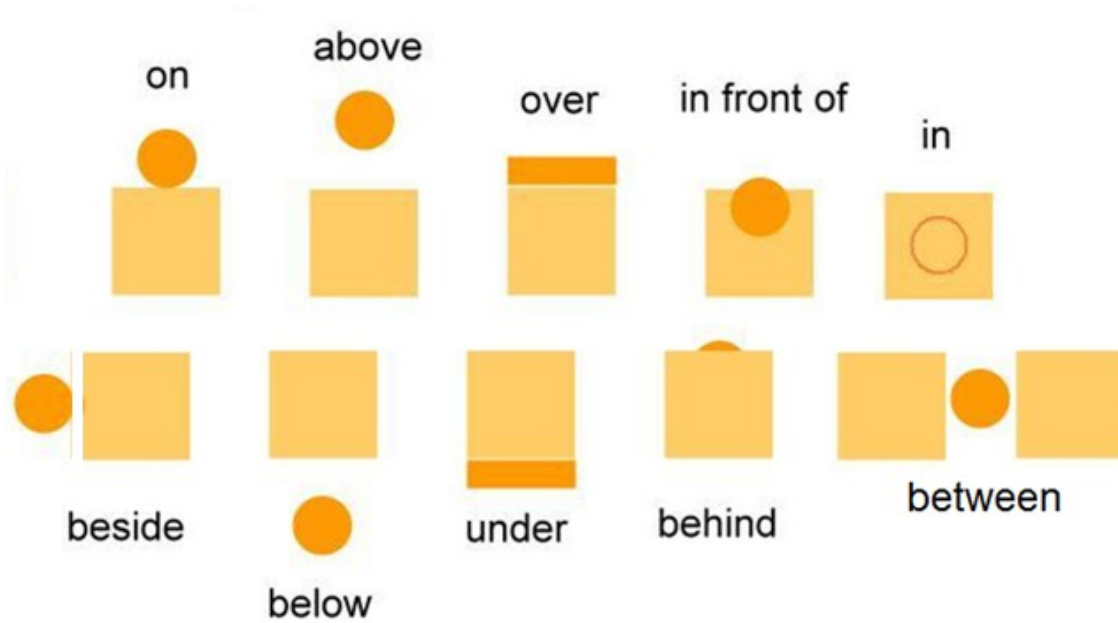
