

English Grammar: Reflexive Pronouns (1)

Subject Pronouns	Reflexive Pronouns
I	myself
you (<i>single</i>)	yourself
he	himself
she	herself
it	itself
you (<i>plural</i>)	yourselves
we	ourselves
they	themselves

Reflexive pronouns are used when the **subject** and the **object** are the **same** person. For example:

- He cut **himself** with broken glass.
- I am teaching **myself** to play the piano.
- She always makes a cup of tea for **herself** in the morning.
- They have to cook for **themselves**.

Expressions:

- Please help **yourself**. (*Fique a vontade*) (*comida, bebida, etc.*)
- Make **yourself** at home. (*Sinta-se em casa*)
- Enjoy **yourself**. (*Divirta-se / Aproveite*)
- Behave **yourself**. (*Comporte-se*)
