The possible results are as follows:

A1 – Beginner

Understand basic everyday expressions (“What’s your name?”, “How old are you?”).

Introduce yourself and answer simple questions.

Read short, simple texts with familiar vocabulary.

Write very simple sentences (name, age, likes, etc.).

A2 – Elementary

Understand simple information about everyday situations.

Communicate about routine tasks (shopping, house routines, etc.).

Describe in simple terms aspects of their life, routines, likes and dislikes.

Read short texts such as emails, notes, notices.

Write short, simple messages or paragraphs.

B1 – Intermediate

Understand the main points of given information (work, school, travel, etc.).

Deal with most situations while travelling abroad.

Produce simple connected text on familiar topics.

Describe experiences, events, hopes, and ambitions.

Understand factual texts and everyday topics.

B2 – Upper-Intermediate

Understand the main ideas of complex texts (articles, reports, etc.).

Interact with fluency and spontaneity with native speakers.

Produce clear, detailed text on a wide range of subjects.

Express opinions, advantages, and disadvantages of different options.

Handle most social, academic, and professional situations.

C1 – Advanced

Understand a wide range of long, demanding texts.

Use language flexibly and effectively in social, academic, and professional contexts.

Produce well-structured, detailed, and sophisticated text.

Use nuanced language and express complex ideas clearly.

Follow academic lectures, participate in discussions, and write reports.

C2 – Proficiency

Understand virtually everything heard or read.

Summarise information from different spoken or written sources.

Express yourself spontaneously, fluently and precisely.

Use language at a level close to that of an educated native speaker.

Deal with academic or professional situations using high linguistic sophistication.
