Cobra	from <i>cobra</i> (snake)
Coconut	from <i>coco</i>
Embarrass	from <i>embaraçar</i>
Lambada	a Brazilian dance
Mango	from <i>manga</i> , a tropical fruit
Manioc	from <i>mandioca</i> (Tupi)
Marmalade	from <i>marmelada</i> , a preserve made from <i>marmelo</i>
Massage	from <i>massagem</i>

Piranha	from <i>piranha</i> , from Tupi <i>pirá</i> ("fish") + <i>ánha</i> ("cut")
Port wine	from a drink named after its town of origin (Porto)
Samba	from <i>samba</i> , a dance of Angolan origin
Savvy	from <i>sabe</i> (means "sábio")
Tank	from <i>tanque</i>
Tapioca	from <i>tapioca</i>
Teak	from <i>teca</i>
