

English Pronunciation: Consecutive consonant sounds

It's very common in English for words to have 2 or 3 consecutive consonant sounds. Sometimes, this makes the pronunciation a little difficult. Let's practise

Two consecutive consonant sounds

- stopped (sto-P-T)
- laughed (lar-F-T)
- wished (wi-SH-T)
- length (le-NG-TH)
- fifth (fi-F-TH)

Three consecutive consonant sounds

- cramped (cra-M-P-T)
- tasks (tar-S-K-S)
- asked (ar-S-K-T)
- strengths (stre-NG-TH-S)
- sixth (si-K-S-TH)
- twelfth (twe-L-F-TH)
