

Valentine's Day

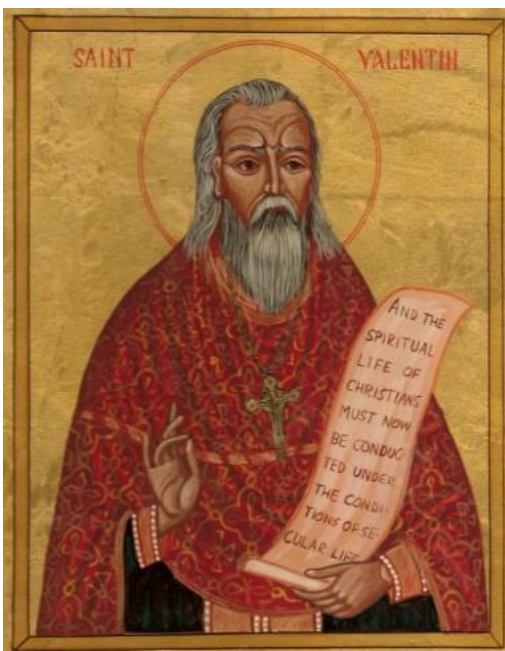
Valentine's Day, also called **Saint Valentine's Day** or the **Feast of Saint Valentine**, is celebrated on February 14th. It originated as a Christian feast to honour Saint Valentinus. Valentine's Day is recognized as a significant cultural, religious, and commercial celebration of romance and love in many countries. However, it is not a public holiday in any country.



Saint Valentine of Rome was imprisoned for performing weddings for soldiers, who were forbidden to marry. During his imprisonment, he restored sight to the blind daughter of a judge, and before his execution, he wrote her a letter signed "Your Valentine" as a farewell.

Valentine's Day first became associated with romance in the 14th century. In the 18th century, it evolved into an occasion in which lovers expressed their love for each other by presenting flowers, chocolates or cards. Symbols that are used today include the heart, the dove and Cupid. During the 20th century, handwritten valentine cards were replaced with mass-produced cards. In some countries, keys are given to lovers as an invitation "to unlock their heart".

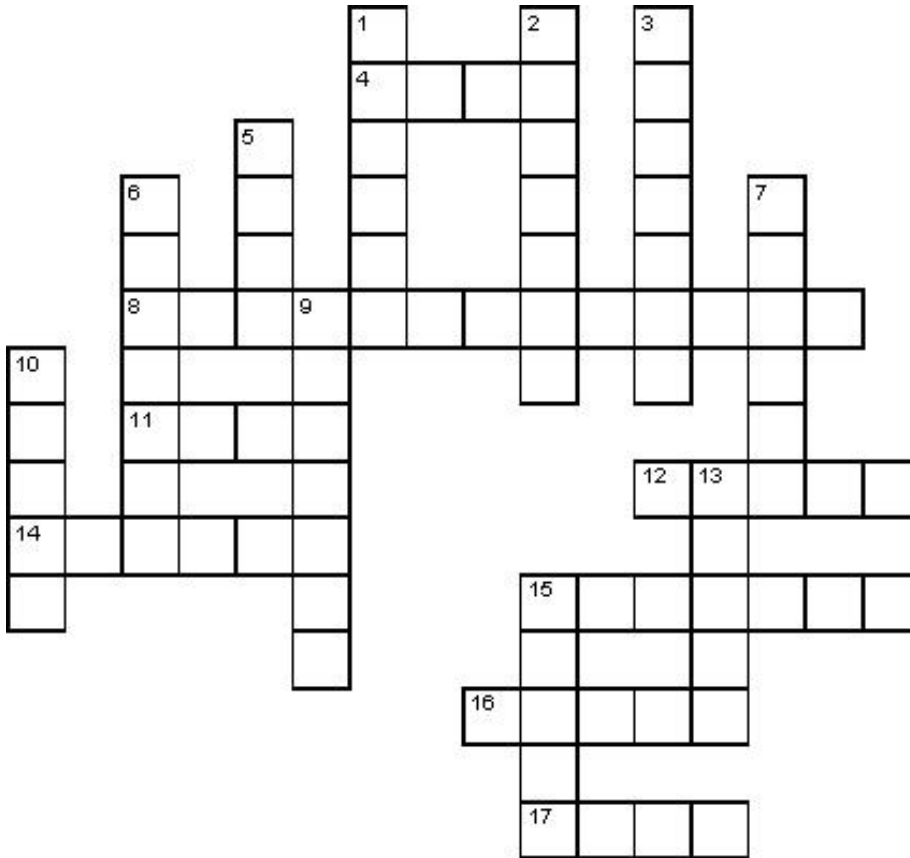
Saint Valentine's Day is an official feast day in the Anglican and Lutheran churches. Many parts of the Eastern Orthodox Church also celebrate Saint Valentine's Day, on July 6th in honour of Saint Valentine, and also on July 30th in honour of Valentine, the Bishop of Interamna.

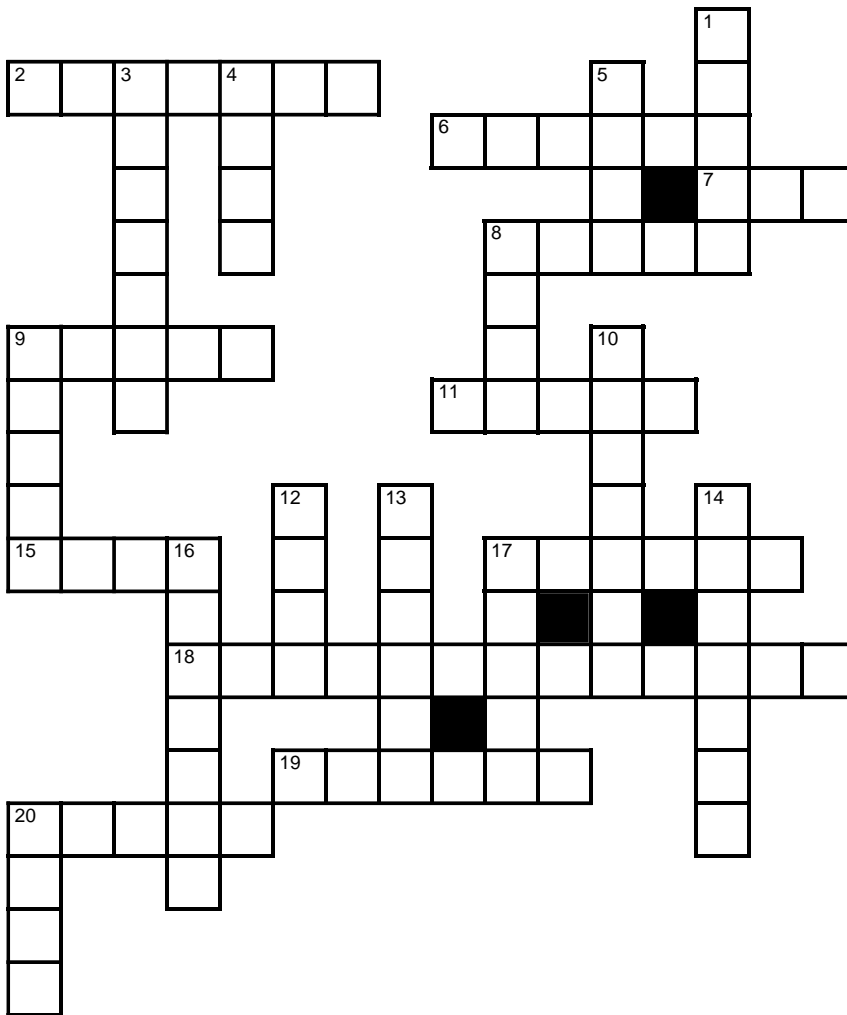
