Some example sentences:

1. It's always difficult to **break up** after a long time together. (*break up = separate*)
2. We should **check in** before 6pm to guarantee our room.
- 3a. We must **check out** before midday.
- 3b. Hey – **check out** the new Black Mirror season! It's amazing! (*check out = investigate*)
4. Enjoy your trip to Europe. When will you **come back**?
5. Many trees **fell down** yesterday in the storm.
6. When the dog fell asleep, he **fell off** the sofa. It was so funny!
7. I want to **find out** why I have so many headaches. (*find out = discover*)
8. A: Do you speak French? B: Not very well, but I **get by**. (*get by = survive*)
9. Let's **get in** the house – it's starting to rain.
10. Please **get your feet off** the sofa, they're dirty.
11. I think we should **get on** the train – it'll leave very soon.
12. Unfortunately, I don't **get on with** my brother. (*get on with = have a good relationship with*)
13. Let's **get out** the house today – it's sunny for a change!
14. I think I will never **get over** the death of my father.
15. My wife always takes hours to **get ready**.
16. I never **get up** after 7am, but frequently before.
17. A: I'm going to sell my car for \$100. B: What! You're **giving it away**!
18. A: Can you lend me your iPad? B: Sure, but please **give it back** before tonight, I'll need it.
19. I believe that Ukraine will never **give in**. (*give in = surrender*)
20. I really should **give up** smoking. (*give up something = stop something*)
21. I intend to **go away** for 3 months. I need a break from work.
22. I need to **go back** – I've forgotten my wallet.
23. Let's **go down** to the hotel reception and ask them for clean towels.
24. Please **go in**, the doctor is ready for you now.
25. I'm sorry, please **go on** – I am listening now.
26. My wife and I always **go out** on Friday nights, usually to a restaurant.
27. I need to **go up** to the hotel room, as I've forgotten my sunglasses.
28. When my son **grows up**, he wants to be a pilot.
29. We need to **hurry up**, otherwise we will miss our flight.
- 30a. We must **keep out of** the house – it's being fumigated. (*keep out of = do not enter*)
- 30b. Please **keep the cat out of** the kitchen – he will eat the chicken. (*keep out = prevent entry*)
- 31a. I can't **keep up with** technology – it moves too quickly!
- 31b. It's difficult to **keep up with** Bob – he runs so fast!
32. We shouldn't **leave him out of** the game, he'll be very upset. (*leave out of = omit*)
33. Please don't **let me down**. Study hard!
34. I must **lie down** – my headache is getting worse.
35. You must **log in** (*or log on*) before you can use the computer.
36. You must always **log out** (*or log off*) before you go home.
37. I have to **look after** my sick mother every day – it takes a lot of my time. (*see #54*)

38. Can you please help me **look for** my keys – I can't find them.
39. My grandfather **passed away** last week. The funeral is on Friday.
40. When you come home, can you **pass by** the supermarket and buy some milk?
41. I **pick up** my son from school at 4pm every day.
42. Can you **pull in** here for 2 minutes? I want to stretch my legs.
43. He **pulled up** so quickly, that the dog fell off the back seat!
44. Can you please **put away** your clothes – your room is a mess!
- 45a. I have to **put down** my cases for a minute – they're so heavy!

- 46b. I think I'll **put on** a sweater. It's getting cold. (*opposite of #55*)
47. I think we're **running out of** coffee. Let me check. Wow – we have already **run out!**
48. I bought a new computer yesterday. I intend to **set it up** today.
49. My computer **shut down** unexpectedly. I hope it's OK.
50. I need to **sit down** – I'm a little dizzy.
51. We have to **stand up** when the teacher enters the room.
52. My daughter **takes after** her mother – she never stops talking!
53. I will **take it away** and eat it at home.
54. I have to **take care of** my sick mother every day – it takes a lot of my time. (*see #37*)
- 55a. The Japanese always **take off** their shoes at home. (*opposite of #46*)
- 55b. The airplane **took off** on time.
- 56a. It's your turn to **take out** the trash today.
- 56b. I always **take my wife out** for dinner on our anniversary.
57. I think I'll **throw out** these shoes – they're full of holes.
