

Present Perfect: Experience - Have you ever?

We use the word "ever" in a Present Perfect construction to ask about experience. The word "ever" means "once" or "one time" (PT: *uma vez*). For example:

A: **Have you ever** seen a ghost?

B: Yes, I **have**. / No, I **haven't**.
