Some bingo numbers have names. Here are some examples:

<u>#</u>	<u>Name</u>	<u>How it's spoken</u>
2	One little duck	"One little duck – number 2"
3	Cup of tea	"Cup of tea – number 3"
4	Knock at the door	"Knock at the door – number 4"
6	Half a dozen	"Half a dozen – number 6"
7	Lucky for some	"Lucky for some – number 7"
8	Garden gate	"Garden gate – number 8"
11	Legs	"Legs eleven"
12	One dozen	"One dozen – number 12"
13	Unlucky for some	"Unlucky for some – 13"
16	Sweet sixteen	"Sweet sixteen"
17	Dancing queen	"Dancing queen – 17"
21	Key of the door	"Key of the door – 21"
22	Two little ducks	"Two little ducks – 22"
50	It's a bullseye	"It's a bullseye – 50"
66	Clickety click	"Clickety click – 66"
70	Three score and ten	"Three score and ten – 70"
88	Two fat ladies	"Two fat ladies – 88"
