<b>no</b> (0%)	<b>nobody / no-one</b> <i>(ninguém)</i>	<b>nothing</b> <i>(nada)</i>	<b>nowhere / no place</b> <i>(em nenhum lugar)</i>	<b>no time (= never)</b> <i>(em nenhum momento / nunca)</i>	<b>no way</b> <i>(de jeito nenhum)</i>

### A Funny Story

Once upon a time, there were four people. Their names were **Everybody**, **Somebody**, **Nobody** and **Anybody**.

When there was an important job to be done, **Everybody** was sure that **Somebody** would do it. **Anybody** could do it, but **Nobody** did it.

When **Nobody** did it, **Everybody** got angry. **Everybody** thought that **Somebody** would do it, but **Nobody** realized that it wouldn't be done.

Consequently, **Everybody** blamed **Somebody** when **Nobody** did what **Anybody** could have done.

Note that all of these words are “**third person singular**”:

- Everybody **drinks** water.
- Everything **is** awesome.
- Nowhere **is** safe.
- Nothing **is** certain.
- Anything **is** OK for me.
- Something **is** stuck to my shoe.
- **Does** anybody have a pen?

The word "**any**" has two possible contexts:

1) "**any**"="undefined quantity" in negative sentences and questions

Examples: I don't have **any** money.  
Do you have **any** money?

2) "**any**" = "random choice" (*PT: qualquer*)

Example: A: Which cake would you like?  
B: **Any** one is OK for me.
